




Antler Stain Application Instructions




The stain uses a *Potassium Permanganate* base, it is perfectly normal for it to be *purple* coloured - it will not turn your antler purple! (It oxidises to *brown* after application)




Protective gloves are recommended if you don't want purple skin!

1 Ensure the antlers are thoroughly clean and free of dust and debris before you begin the staining process.




2 Dilute the stain with water in a small bowl, 1 part stain to 5 parts water.

3 Mask off the skull to avoid runoff, leaving the antlers exposed. Use an artist's brush to apply the stain in thin layers, applying more to the valleys and channels than to the tops of the pearly and ridges. To achieve a more natural look, do not coat the tips of any tines. Use a damp sponge or cloth to rub the stain of the peaks of the pearly and ridges.




Masking

Repeat this process 6-10 times allowing 30 minutes for the coats to dry between applications



Don't be afraid to darken down the valleys and buff out the peaks. It's all about achieving the natural finish you're happiest with!
